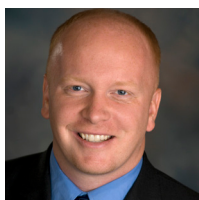

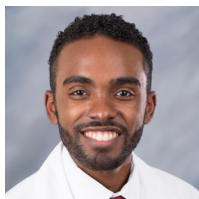

Upon finishing his fellowship at Mayo, he will be doing an additional year of advanced fellowship training at the National Institutes of Health in immunotherapy clinical trial development. 6. Demonstrate how to fulfill that need once it is recognized.



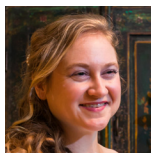

3. Demonstrate and challenge attendees to see how their calling as a physician provides the basis for resilience.



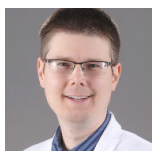

To explore ways to share Jesus in an optometric setting on a daily basis as God puts patients in our path where He can use us.



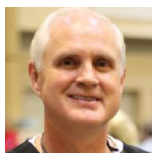

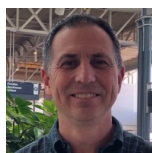
