SUMMARY:

Ellen White stated 90% of disease could be prevented with appropriate lifestyle modifications. Modern studies are showing a huge connection between mind and physical disease. Therefore, if we only focus on physical and leave the mental/spiritual unaddressed, all too often we don't get to the root cause of disease. Hence for AMEN members to be effective they must integrate both regardless of specialty. God called AMEN to lead by example in making these connections.

OBJECTIVES:

At the end of the presentation, the learner will be able to:

- 1. Describe the connection between spiritual and physical health in regards to disease.
- 2. Discuss, using practical examples, how to comfortably and effectively integrate spiritual care with physical care.
- 3. Illustrate how the gospel is not only linked to, but necessary, for addressing physical ailments as God provides the power for the patient to make real, lasting change.
- 4. Trace the history of AMEN and a glimpse of where it will lead.

Dr. Brian Schwartz is an Interventional and Structural Heart Cardiologist and serves as Medical Director of the Heart and Vascular Service Line at Kettering Health in Dayton, Ohio. Having been personally touched by the power of the gospel, Dr. Schwartz longed to make his medical work a healing ministry. His association with AMEN has helped him integrate prayer and Christian spirituality into his practice in a more intentional and natural way. Dr. Schwartz served as the editor of the Medical Evangelist (AMEN's journal) for 10 years and as AMEN President for 5 years. SUMMARY:

Do you struggle with cherished sin(s)? Do you question if you are really saved? Do you wonder if God's promises of freedom, peace, and fullness of joy could ever be true in your life? As a third-generation Adventist, Johnny struggled with all three of these questions while living as an 'Adventist Pharisee' until God freed him this past year from

addiction to a cherished sin and from a righteousness-by-works lifestyle. Now, like the lepers of 2 Kings 7, he wants to share what he has found and experienced: life more abundant through abiding in Christ

OBJECTIVES:

At the end of the presentation, the learner will be able to:

- 1. Describe the importance of providing whole-person care with an emphasis on spiritual care in the clinical setting.
- 2. Identify the positive impact effectively providing spiritual care in the clinical setting has on patient Quality of Life and perceived Quality of Care.
- 3. Explain how abundant private communion with God leads to effective and abundant public ministry for God both inside and outside the clinic.
- 4. Implement practical ways to replace workplace anxiety with the peace of abiding in God amidst a busy clinic schedule.
- Apply practical ways they learned to share Christ through health evangelism both inside and outside the clinic and earnestly seek God's plans for their unique, individual situations for living a life more abundant through Him.

Dr. Johnny Ahn is a dermatology resident in Florida, and within the last year, his greatest passion has become abiding in Christ. He enjoys supporting the F5 Challenge and the Evangeliving Facebook group through united prayer, and he believes every trip outside his apartment is a mission trip. SUMMARY:

Why were many physicians enthusiastic leaders of the eugenics movement at the turn of the twentieth century? How does the underlying fear they held still influence medicine, and even spiritual care, today? In this seminar, we will be addressing both what spiritual care is and what it is not. Through this process, attendees will be empowered to provide Christ-centered spiritual care more confidently, even in the direct of circumstances.



OBJECTIVES:

At the end of the presentation, the learner will be able to:

- 1. Provide an overview of spiritual care principles within healthcare settings.
- 2. Assess common fears and pitfalls in the implementation of spiritual care support, specifically in the context of terminal or chronic patient conditions.
- 3. Identify steps to reduce fear of professional or spiritual inadequacy in providing whole person spiritual care to patients, particularly when a patient's physical prognosis is poor.
- 4. Expand their conception of spiritual care from simply being an act or intervention to instead being a complete modality of care.

Management of Thyroid Eye Disease/ Global Ophthalmology Update



SUMMARY:

This presentation will focus on how thyroid disease affects the eyes. It will cover how to diagnose and assess patients with Thyroid Eye Disease and what signs and symptoms patients may have as well as how to treat and manage these patients. Emphasis will also focus on new treatment modalities. In addition, an update will be given on the state of global blindness and the efforts that Loma Linda University is making to address these issues, particularly in the countries of Fiji and Sierra Leone.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Provide an overview of diagnosis and assessment of patients with Thyroid Eye Disease
- 2. Discuss updates to the treatment of Thyroid Eye disease
- 3. Discuss state of Global Blindness and share the efforts of Loma Linda University to address blindness in Fiji and Sierra Leone

Dr. Sandy is an Ophthalmologist and fellowship trained Ophthalmic Plastics, Orbital and Reconstructive Surgeon. She currently works at Trinity Regional Eye Care serving the Western Dakotas and also serves as Adjunct Assistant Professor at Loma Linda Eye Institute. A native of Sierra Leone, Dr. Sandy is passionate about meeting the needs of underserved populations both locally and abroad. She is particularly excited about missions and the opportunity to partner with Christ in restoring both physical and spiritual sight.

Dr. Roquiz is a family and lifestyle medicine physician currently practicing in Sebring Florida at AdventHealth Medical Group Family & Lifestyle Medicine. After completing medical school and residency in Southern California, his journey lead him to North Idaho where he practiced and lived like a medical missionary – surviving on pastor's wage, living in a garage for 2 years. It was some of the best years of his life.
