"...'Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit,' Says the Lord of hosts." - **ZECHARIAH 4:6 NKJV**

How did Jesus — a carpenter by training — minister as the greatest medical missionary this world has ever seen or will see?

In three years, Jesus restored a leper, gave sight to a blind man, resurrected the dead to life, and performed so many healing miracles that if they were written one by one, even the world itself could not contain the books that should be written.¹

How? By the Holy Spirit.

"God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power, who went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him."²

And Jesus promised that "he who believes in Me, the works that I do he will do also; and greater works than these he will do, because I go to My Father."³

"By this Christ did not mean that the disciples' work would be of a more exalted character than His, but that it would have greater extent. He did not refer merely to miracle working, but to all that would take place under the working of the Holy Spirit."⁴

Jesus revealed no qualities, and exercised no powers, that men may not have through faith in Him. His perfect humanity is that which all His followers may possess, if they will be in subjection to God as He was.⁵

"The preaching of the word will be of no avail without the continual presence and aid of the Holy Spirit. This is the only effectual teacher of divine truth. Only when the truth is accompanied to the heart by the Spirit will it quicken the conscience or transform the life. One might be able to present the letter of the word of God, he might be familiar with all its commands and promises; but unless the Holy Spirit sets home the truth, no souls will fall on the Rock and be broken.

No amount of education, no advantages, however great, can make one a channel of light without the cooperation of the Spirit of God. The sowing of the gospel seed will not be a success unless the seed is quickened into life by the dew of heaven. Before one book of the New Testament was written, before one gospel sermon had been preached after Christ's ascension, the Holy Spirit came upon the praying apostles."⁶

During our time together, we will explore three aspects of the Holy Spirit: 1. **Healing:** God wants to heal us to help heal others.

Before preaching the Gospel to Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and the end of the earth, Jesus's disciples needed to be healed of sin, especially pride and selfishness, that caused division among them. For this, Jesus rejoiced to give the Holy Spirit because the sickness of sin could be resisted and overcome only through the mighty agency of the Holy Spirit.⁷

As the Holy Spirit empowers us to reflect Christ in our everyday interactions with patients and coworkers, we can demonstrate compassion, empathy, and a genuine concern for the holistic well-being of our neighbors – turning regular work days into extraordinary medical mission opportunities where we share the life-transforming message of eternal hope and freedom in Jesus Christ.

 Unity: God has promised that His Spirit can bring unity. As the disciples united in prayer and supplication in the upper room, the Holy Spirit united them.⁸

The Holy Spirit unites us in our shared purpose of bringing healing and salvation as we reach out to the world with God's love.

3. **Freedom:** God desires our freedom – freedom from sin, sickness, and death. In a broken and hurting world, the gospel offers true liberation, and Jesus said that the Spirit of the Lord was upon him because he "anointed me to proclaim" good news to the poor, he has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners."⁹

Once the disciples were in one place and one accord, they freely preached the Gospel with divine power from the Holy Spirit.

Through preaching the gospel, we have the privilege of introducing individuals to the transformative power of Jesus – offering them a life of purpose, forgiveness, and eternal salvation by His Spirit.

We invite you to join us as we explore the extraordinary combination of medical missionary work and gospel proclamation. Through inspiring presentations, practical seminars, and heartfelt discussions, we will deepen our understanding of how the Holy Spirit works through us to bring healing, unity, and freedom.

DESCRIPTION:

We are told that the truth for this time, the third angel's message, is to be connected with true medical missionary work. As physicians and dentists, we sense a call to mission, a call to action compelled by the gospel commission declared in the first sentence of Matthew 28:19, "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations", and the promise in verse 20, "Lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Jesus tells us that He will be with us through the presence and work of His Holy Spirit. We will study the office work of the Holy Spirit in three key areas: Health, Unity, and Freedom. We will draw from a book written by a physician, the Book of Acts.

The 1% Difference John Shin, MD




DESCRIPTION:



Naren James, MD (1962 – 2021) AMEN Founder and 1st President

Dr. Naren James practiced medicine for 24 years. He incorporated his Christian faith with every patient he saw and many people were impacted by his love for Christ. He had a passion for medical evangelism and was the Founder of AMEN.



Dr. James was passionate about using health ministry as the opening wedge and strove to live "By His Spirit". In the first issue of the AMEN Journal he wrote...

"As I studied the life of Christ I was impressed and as I looked closer, I realized that His effectiveness was a direct result of His devotional life. I decided to double my morning devotional time and then tripled it. Today, I find myself spending 4 times as much time as I did with the Lord a little over 5 years ago.

Believe me, the results have been tangible. First, the stress of practice left, fear departed and my heart was changed to where I have a deep love for my wife, my daughter, my patients, my employees and the people who work around me. From that flows my own personal effectiveness for Him in all my endeavors, both secular and spiritual. He invites all of you to experience the same. He calls us to set aside a portion of your most precious commodity, your time, for communion with Him. In doing so, your effectiveness will be multiplied and your impact for His kingdom will be much more far-reaching."

Being invited to the AMEN organizing meeting in 2005 by Dr. Fred Bischoff was life changing. I had been convicted that I needed to engage my patients spiritually but I had no practice experience in doing this. I was challenged by Pastor Finley to begin praying with my patients and then to start sharing simple bible verses of encouragement. I left that meeting convicted and immediately put it into practice when I got home. It initially was way out of my comfort



zone but the response from patients was so amazing I quickly embraced this approach. Since that time my practice has become a ministry as opposed to a career. Burnout became a thing of the past. Every day as I start with prayer I wonder who God is going to send my way and what impact sharing Jesus can have in their lives. AMEN has inspired me over the years to incorporate new things and has helped keep me centered on why I was called to medicine. It has led to explosive results by combining the power of the gospel with medical ministry. I believe that this combination will be like fire in the stubble to complete the call to share the SDA message around the world.

How did you become involved in AMEN?

My father was a minister that was very interested in medical missionary evangelism and outreach. He worked with many physicians in evangelistic outreach. Occasionally we went to conference or union Doctor-Minister conferences. My Dad was actively involved with Dr. MacFarland and we were at the first New York City Stop Smoking Plan that started in a blizzard



and still was crowded to capacity. Such exposure made me very interested in working with ministers after becoming a physician. During my practice I found that unions and conferences were not interested in doctor-medical retreats, so I was very excited to become acquainted with Dr. Naren James at ASI and see we shared the same passion. I joined a small group which became a steering committee and board for what became AMEN two decades ago. With the guidance of Pastor Finley we quit talking about it and launched the first national AMEN conference and the AMEN Journal.

How has Amen Impacted your life?

AMEN has introduced me to many wonderful health providers around the world that have not only provided new friendships, but given me helpful insights into bringing soul-winning into my practice. I learned how to pray with patients and staff at AMEN. I have learned much about health evangelism methods that leads beyond health education to souls in the kingdom. This includes wiser ways to bring bridge-building literature into my practice. How did you become involved in AMEN?

Twenty Years ago, at a National ASI Convention, Dr. Naren James approached me with a Spiritinspired idea. When we visited about the possibility of an organization of medical professionals focused on mission his thoughts resonated with me. I sensed almost immediately that our committed medical professionals had unprecedented opportunities to share Christ's love with their patients. The concept of an organization that would facilitate mission and further equip

medical professionals to be more effective witnesses for Christ and participate in a variety of multi-faceted outreach initiatives was certainly a heaven inspired idea. In that brief encounter AMEN was conceived, and the last twenty years have demonstrated the positive results of medical professionals focused on mission.

How has Amen Impacted your life?

AMEN has impacted my life in significant ways. Based on the ministry of Christ and the divine inspiration of the writings of Ellen White, I have always believed that God has called ministers and medical professionals to unite in mission. AMEN has practically demonstrated the mission effectiveness of physicians ministering to the needs of their patients.
