

Free Radicals in Practice: The good, the bad, and oxidative stress*

Todd Guthrie, MD – AMEN President

It is the last hour of earth's history. Stressful times are here, with more to come. How will we react to these challenges? A short primer on free radicals may provide some spiritual lessons we can apply in our own practices.

Objectives:

- 1. Review and update of the function of free radicals and their impact on health.
- 2. Understand good vs bad effects of free radicals.
- 3. Learn how to apply these principles in patient care.



Dr. Todd Guthrie is a board certified orthopedic surgeon, practicing in Mt. Shasta, California. Dr. Guthrie sees AMEN as a catalyst to further facilitate the bringing together of the everlasting gospel of Revelation 14:6-12 and the Adventist health message. He firmly believes that medical missionary evangelism will open hearts in preparation for, and in conjunction with, the outpouring of God's Spirit in the final days of earth's history. Radical Faith, Love & Mission

Jeremy Arnall

Friday: Radical Faith - Sabbath: Radical Love - Sunday: Radical Mission

God calls His Laodicean Church to embrace a radical faith and life in these last days. In these three messages, we will consider the radical implications of such a calling.



A graduate of Southern Adventist University, Jeremy Arnall currently serves as senior pastor at the Greeneville Seventh-day Adventist Church in Greeneville, TN. For nearly 8 years he has enjoyed serving this active congregation. Together they have sought to explore and expand new and creative ways of outreach to their community. He is married to his childhood sweetheart, Tina, and together they have two young boys, Jason & Jordan. Their hobbies include backpacking, photography and travel.

Radical: burning, balance or flame out?*^ Edwin Nebblett, MD

A 2012 article reported in the Archives of Internal Medicine that 45.8% of physicians surveyed reported having either emotional exhaustion, depersonalization or low personal accomplishment in their work. A Harris Interactive online survey in 2013 revealed that 60 percent of healthcare workers felt burned out on their jobs. The Wealthy Dentist surveyed their readership in 2000 and 81% of dentists reported professional burnout in their careers. Why is this so? What can be done? We will explore these questions in our session.

Objectives:

- 1. Explore Why we do what we do.
- 2. Identify the demands of work, life, and ministry and how we find a balance.
- 3. Discuss the symptoms of burnout.
- 4. Identify ways to relieve stress.
- 5. Challenge attendees to live radically resulting in perpetual joy.



Dr. Edwin Nebblett currently practices family medicine, serving two small clinics in Catron county, New Mexico. His passion for sharing the principles of good health is surpassed only by his desire to live and share the practical gospel. Dr. Nebblett and his family regularly speak at churches and campmeetings, helping families to embrace Jesus Christ as an ever-present help in life's challenges. Edwin is married to Maria; the couple have four young-adult children whose joy it is to engage in ministry with their parents.

Radial Practice* John Torquato, MD

Desperate people will do radical things. The motive which causes desperation will tell of character, influence destiny, and alter your practice of medicine.

Objectives:

- 1. Learn the essential elements necessary to radically transform a practice into an evangelistic center of influence.
- 2. Review principles from the Bible that will direct a radical transformation of health care practice.
- 3.Be challenged with a model of radical practice that will transform your personal life, bless the church, and has the power to transform the way evangelism is done in your community.



Dr. Torquato is a graduate of LLU School of Medicine, practicing Family Medicine in Hayden, Idaho and Spokane Valley, Washington. Torquato's personal goal is to use medical ministry to complete the gospel commission. To that end, he has spent the last 17 years working in self-supporting medical offices with ministry as the primary focus. He believes in teamwork, working closely with pastors, local church members, and an amazing group of office staff. Together he and his team are honored to offer complete healing to their local community. Torquato and his wife Cherie, have four children: Heather, Luke, Caleb and Carissa.

Radical Resolution: the Healing Faith and Rest of Christ.

John Howe, MD

"Radical Resolution" describes both the moral vision to recognize our brokenness and the resolve to live with integrity. The Faith of Christ and the Rest (as in Sabbath Rest) of Christ will be explored as the healing instruments of God to wholeness and salvation.

Busyness, Spirituality, and Vision Mark Finley, DD

One of the great challenges to a meaningful spiritual life is busyness. It is a challenge that medical/dental students and professionals face on a daily basis. During this session we will explore practical principles of the deeper spiritual life in a hectic world. We will also discuss three of the greatest time consumers and how to turn "dead time" into positively refreshing spiritual moments. The goal of this exercise is to grow together in our understanding of what it means to live a godly life in a fast paced 21st century world and how to accomplish it. We will discuss how to keep your vision clear in the context of a hectic medical/dental practice.



Pastor Finley currently serves as an assistant to the president of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists. He is a renowned evangelist, having presented more than 200 evangelistic series around the world. Medical evangelism is near and dear to Finley's heart. He began integrating stress, smoking cessation, health expos, cooking schools and mini health talks into his evangelistic meetings early in his ministry. Session A

Clinic to Go: The Mechanics of a Portable Church and Community Dental Clinic[^] Abel Loredo, DDS Esmeralda 6

Having always been mission-minded, an invitation to serve at a free, church sponsored, Medical/Dental clinic 2 years ago, started Dr. Loredo on a new path. Seeing the need for LOCAL CHURCHES to provide free dental care to their communities, prompted him to create a 12-chair, mobile clinic. Since January 2016, those 12 mobile units have served 435 people at 6 different SDA churches. In August, taking 22 mobile units to Seaside, CA, 156 homeless Veterans were served at a 2-day, multi services, Veterans Stand Down event. Not only are the patients positively impacted at these clinics but all the volunteer staff members experience the joy of service and want to do it again!

Objectives:

- 1. Explain how to develop resources and manage raw materials in order to assemble a portable clinic
- 2. Identify how to integrate church leadership and volunteers with clinic events
- 3. Discuss how to best optimize the portable clinic to benefit the community



Dr. Abel Loredo graduated from Loma Linda University Dental School in 1984. He spent the next 3 years at a Public Health clinic in Oregon before setting up private practice in California. Together with his wife Bonnie, Dr. Loredo has 4 children, 3 of which are at Weimar College, pursuing Pre-Nursing and Pre-Med. Their oldest son is a Medical Device Representative.

Radical Journey*

Andrew Roquiz, MD (with John Torquato, MD) Valencia I

This seminar will inspire you as you hear how God's radical call led a young physician from the comfortable living of Southern California to living on a Pastor's salary and moving into a garage. You will learn how the concept of radical margin can unleash your life for ministry.

Objectives:

- 1. Radical Call: The attendee will be able to define and identify the features of calling and understand its significance
- 2. Radical Trust: The attendee will be able to define and identify the features of trust in God and understand its significance

3. Radical Margin: The attendee will be able to define and identify the concept of margin and its significance. The speaker will demonstrate how a medical practice can be both successful and sacrificial.

Pain Management* Joe Kim. MD

Objectives:

- 1. Curbing the opioid epidemic: indications for therapy, initiating/terminating therapy, complying to state and federal regulations
- 2.5-minute low back pain consult: identifying red flags, indications for conservative management, indications for costly assessment tools.
- 3. Review of modalities of care: Comparison of treatment modalities when conservative management fails: assessment of efficacy of physical therapy, injections, psychotherapy, and surgery.



Dr. Joe Kim is board certified in both anesthesiology and pain management. After completing his fellowship at Johns Hopkins he joined a practice with the prior president of the American Academy of Pain Management. He now practices in Yakima. Washington where he lives with his wife Jacquelyn, and their two young children. Their passion is using health ministry as a path to personal Bible studies.

Praying with Patients*

Brian Schwartz, MD and Brock Arms, DDS (with Mark Finley, DD) Prayer Room: Mountain View

This seminar will be led off by Pastor Mark Finley. He will share tips on how to initiate a spiritual conversion by offering to pray with your patients. Dr. Brian Schwartz will then share stories from his practice where praying with patients was the pivotal factor to achieving a great physical outcome, in addition to the spiritual impact it has had on his patients and how just starting with prayer has changed his practice into a ministry. Dr. Schwartz was inspired and began implementing praver in his office after hearing Pastor Finley many years ago at one of the first AMEN conferences.

Dentist, Dr. Brock Arms will then share his experiences praving with patients after he was inspired by Dr. Schwartz's "Praying with Patients" seminar given at an AMEN conference just a couple years ago. Together they will share powerful testimonies on how to begin using praver in your practice.

- 1. Discuss the value and importance of praying with (for) patients
- 2. Identify "do's and don'ts" in clinically based prayer
- 3. Demonstrate how to begin praying with patients


